Mezzo-soprano Dr. Isabelle Ganz has had a long and varied career in numerous musical fields. Beginning as a pianist, she was a soloist with the New York Philharmonic at age 10. At 20, she formed a folk singing duo with her first husband, Peter Gardner. "The Gardners" were the opening

act for Joan Baez, Judy Collins, Bob Dylan, The Smothers Brothers, Simon and Garfunkel and many others. She later specialized in classical contemporary music, working with composers such as John Cage and Luciano Berio. She formed the Sephardic music ensemble, Alhambra in 1981. The group has toured throughout the world and has recorded 3 CDs.

She holds a DMA in Voice and Music Literature from the Eastman School of Music, was awarded an NEA Solo Recitalist Grant to perform contemporary music at colleges throughout the US, and was a Fulbright Scholar in Jerusalem. She has recorded over 20 albums and CDs, incluing "Let's Call the Whole Thing Off: Songs of the Gershwins" with pianist Edward Murray. Dr. Mary Carol Warwick is a composer and librettist whose works are enjoying American and International performances. A protégé of noted opera composer Carlisle Floyd, her works include several chamber operas for children commissioned and premiered by Houston Grand Opera, including the bi-lingual operas

Cinderella in Spain and Rapunzel. She has composed for solo instruments, ensembles and string orchestra.

As a Music Director, Warwick has worked for Theater Under the Stars in such productions as Kismet, The Sound of Music, and a revival of Cabin in the Sky; for Main Street Theater in such productions as Something More and Sweeney Todd; and for Theater LAB, she served as Music Director for the Houston premieres of shows including Boy Groove and The Last Five Years.

Warwick has won numerous awards and grants to compose works, including Challenge Grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, Opera New World Grants, the Mayor's Proud Partner Award from the city of Houston, and a commission from NASA to write a wake-up call for Space Shuttle Mission STS-33.
